State Senator Dr. Ed Hernandez Endorses Congresswoman Grace Napolitano

Congresswoman Napolitano is currently serving her ninth term representing California’s 32nd District, where she is the founder and Chair of the Congressional Mental Health Caucus and the Ranking Member on the Subcommittee on Water Resources and Environment.
